

HUMBOLDT COUNTY LIBRARY HONORS HLF AND FRIENDS OF THE REDWOOD LIBRARIES

On April 21, 2009, the Humboldt County Library hosted its annual Volunteer Recognition event. This event is held every year to honor those individuals who give of their time and energy to the betterment of the library for the citizens of Humboldt County. With upward of 100 individuals in attendance, this event was considered one of the largest and most successful to date.

This year special recognition and honor was given to the President of the Humboldt Library Foundation Elizabeth Murguia, the President of the Friends of the Redwood Libraries and the presidents of the 10 branch library Friends groups in Humboldt County. They were each presented with an engraved president's pin.

The theme this year was Volunteers a Gift to the Community, co-chaired by Ronda Wittenberg, Humboldt County Library Division Manager -Circulation; and Kenzie Mullen, Trinidad Library Branch Manager. Special invited guest speaker was Carla Lehn, Library Programs Consultant for the California State Library. Lehn addressed the value of community involvement and spoke of recent studies and trends for Baby Boomers coming into the volunteer workforce, along with new volunteer developments at the state level.

Since this event and as a result of Lehn's involvement at the state level, the Humboldt County Library is now in partnership with Volunteer Match. With 200 individuals giving weekly throughout the library system, this new partnership will help to streamline recruitment for an already successful volunteer program.

H LF AWARDS \$30,000 TO HUMBOLDT COUNTY LIBRARY

HLF was pleased to make grants to the library this year for a variety of program opportunities. The funds were used primarily for the purchase of books and materials to expand and improve the collection. We partnered with Eureka Rotary to support the Children's Reading Program and with library patrons in northern Humboldt County to contribute to the

HLF KICKS OFF "BUY A BOOK" CAMPAIGN


